Membership in the Legal Division is FREE if you are a member of the Special Libraries Association and choose the Legal Division as your primary division.

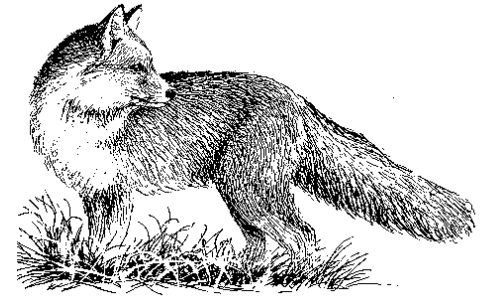
If you are already a member of SLA and have chosen another division as your first choice, you can still join the Legal Division for only \$ 15.00!
